We are thrilled to announce the launch of our Bachelor of Science in Emergency Services Administration, a pioneering program designed to meet the urgent workforce needs in public safety and emergency services. As California faces increasing challenges in disaster preparedness and health care, our new degree offers an affordable and accessible pathway to careers that are essential for safeguarding our communities. Graduates will emerge as leaders, equipped to tackle the complexities of public safety in the Bay Area and beyond. The Bachelor's Degree program will launch in Fall 2026. Best of all, it will be tuition free!

- The Sustainability Committee organized impactful events for Earth Month in March, including an **Eco Fair** and e-waste recycling. The committee earned commendation from the Mayor of Santa Clara for dedication to environmental stewardship.
- The Child Development Department hosted a dynamic symposium in March for its **Child Development Apprenticeship Program**. The program emphasizes access to childcare for low-income individuals and highlighted collaboration between community organizations. Mission's program is one of only two such programs in Early Childhood Education in the Bay Area.
- **Mission Early College High School**, in partnership with Mission College, received the distinguished California Exemplary Dual Enrollment Award, recognizing their commitment to transformative educational opportunities that empower students.

- In March, the Hospitality Management Department hosted the Pacific Northwest Provincial Jeunes Chefs Rôtisseurs Competition, where four Mission College students–Vicente Gonzales-Archuleta, Sydney Ynez Healy, Gabriel Salazar, and Philip Liu–competed among a talented group of individuals, proudly showcasing the culinary excellence of the college.
- In June, the college formalized a groundbreaking Memorandum of Agreement with Sacramento State University. Under this agreement, students from Mission will have a guaranteed pathway to admission into the prestigious Sac State Black Honors College of California, provided they meet specific academic and commitment criteria.
- The approval of the new **Strategic Education Master Plan** (2024-2027) in June set a visionary course for the future, emphasizing innovation, studentcentered initiatives, and the elimination of equity gaps to better serve our diverse community.
- Mission College proudly marched at Silicon Valley Pride in August, celebrating diversity, unity, and love as the parade made its way through Downtown San Jose. It was a fantastic day filled with community spirit and pride.



- TRIÓ student **Javier Arriaga Camargo** celebrated a significant global achievement by being selected for the Keith Sherin Global Leaders Program, representing Mission College at a prestigious study abroad event in The Hague in the Netherlands this summer.
- Mission College leaders participated in the transformative All African Diaspora
 Education Summit in September in Ghana, connecting with scholars and engaging in empowering projects aimed at supporting Black/African American students.





- The Second Annual Research Symposium in September showcased summer research conducted by 20 Mission students at leading universities and companies, demonstrating the college's unwavering commitment to fostering STEM talent and innovation.
- As a testament to its dedication to student success, Mission College was honored in November as a **2024 Champion**

for Excellence in Placement, receiving the Black English Success Award for its exceptional efforts in supporting Black student success in transfer-level English.



• Women in the Elmwood Correctional Facility in Milpitas received Certificates of Achievement in Communication Studies; while men in the Men's Main Jail received Certificates in Behavioral Health Work in two graduation ceremonies in December as a part of the **Rising Scholars Program**. Mission College continues to be the largest provider of education to justiceimpacted students within the region.

Mechatronics

Through a \$120,000 Mechatronics California Apprenticeship Initiative (CAI) Planning Grant, Mission College secured Department of Labor (DOL) and Division of Apprenticeship Standards (DAS) approval for a registered Hardware Technician Apprenticeship Program, with Applied Materials of Santa Clara as the sponsoring organization. In its first year, the program enrolled three employees from Applied Materials in the one-year Mechatronics Certificate program, setting a strong foundation for industry-driven training.

With a \$947,000 CAI Implementation Grant, Mission is expanding its

reach by partnering with the SEMI Foundation, NIIT (a national apprenticeship intermediary), 66Training, and Network Kinection, two California-based intermediaries in apprenticeship. The college is also collaborating with Santa Clara County Workforce Development Boards, work2future, and NOVA Works, to bring in community members who otherwise wouldn't enroll at Mission or work in advanced manufacturing.

These collaborations aim to expand the college's support of semiconductor and related industries, using the Mechatronics Certificate Program as a foundation. As of 2025, Applied Materials has enrolled three more employees, and two additional manufacturers are developing DOL- and DASregistered apprenticeship programs based on Mission College's Mechatronics Certificate Program.

Equity Workshops for Inclusive Teaching and a Caring Campus

This semester long program allows faculty to work with a talented group of facilitators to enhance their courses through an equity and completion lens. As a Caring Campus, equity is deeply embedded throughout all aspects of our college. The Mission College Classified Equity Certification Program prepares Classified Professionals at Mission College to support student success by incorporating equity-minded leadership and trauma-informed practices into their everyday work. This semester-long program was intentionally designed by and for Mission College professionals, and is the only program of its kind in the state of California. These training programs provide an educational environment where every student feels valued and supported, positioning Mission College as a leader in equity-focused education. Together, the college cultivates a culture of inclusion and belonging that enhances the learning experience for all.

Mission Market Grand Opening

In October, Mission College proudly opened the Mission Market, a vital new resource designed to expand support for students' basic needs. The market offers fresh food, essential items, and emergency aid, demonstrating the college's unwavering commitment to helping students thrive academically and personally. This initiative ensures that all students have access to the resources they need to succeed.

RISE Program: A Celebration of STEM Diversity

The RISE Program is dedicated to helping underrepresented students excel in STEM fields. This initiative connects students with mentorship, internships, and academic support, fostering a new generation of diverse leaders in science, technology, engineering, and math. By investing in students' futures, Mission College strengthens the pipeline of talent in these critical areas.

New APIDA Learning Community Launched

The launch of the Asian Pacific Islander Desi American (APIDA) Learning Community at Mission College aims to support and uplift the APIDA communities. 
