

# MCAS President's Report to the Senate

## April 8, 2021

### Summary of College and District Meetings

These are my personal notes of meetings I attend on behalf of the Senate. Rather than attempt to document fully what transpired, I aim to highlight items of particular interest to faculty and the Senate. If you would like additional information, please ask me or consult the official minutes of each meeting.

#### Board of Trustees: April 6

- Presentation on WV's Educational Master Plan process.
- Approved Mission Mental Health Internship Program. The interns will provide additional mental health support for students starting in Fall.
- Resolution proclaiming May 16–22 as Classified Professionals Week in the West Valley-Mission Community College District.
- Faculty spoke during public comment on the need to maintain composition class caps at 25, create equitable load for noncredit courses, and increase load for labs.

#### College Council: April 7

- Technology Staffing Restructuring
  - Create a Director position for technology to provide campus leadership
  - Will reclassify existing vacant position so minimal budget impact
- Technology Committee Restructuring
  - Reestablish the Technology Committee
- Recommended Updates to Institution Set Standards
  - Recommendation to establish set three-year goals rather than moving targets.

#### Chancellor's Roundtable

- District continues to explore housing for faculty/staff and students. Nothing definite yet but expect discussion in the short/medium term.

#### District Email

- All Mission Faculty email list includes the college president, the VPs, and deans
- New policy for sending emails to our sister college: send email to Niall Adler to forward to WV; faculty no longer have direct access to the all district users email list
- Considering moving some people to A1 Microsoft licenses from A3 licenses. A1 allow email access and web versions of Microsoft programs; A3 allows downloaded versions. Possible groups are emeritus faculty and having new pt faculty opt in to A3.

### ASCCC Area B Fall Meeting: March 26

- ASCCC Vice President's update
  - Ethnic Studies
    - Proposal to require Ethnic Studies for CC students is in process; target is to have it approved by Board of Governors at their July meeting
    - Development of Transfer Model Curriculum (TMC) for Ethnic Studies is in process
  - OER
    - Call for proposals is out for faculty to develop OER materials (check with Joanna if you are interested in this work). OER textbooks coming soon in a number of disciplines including Biology.
  - Transfer Model Curriculum
    - Working to align TMC/ADTs with UC Transfer Pathways
  - State Legislation
    - AB417: Rising Scholars Network: provide funds to 50 community colleges to support currently/formerly incarcerated students
    - AB421: Career Development Courses: intended to equalize funding between credit and noncredit
    - Remove pilot designation from the Community College baccalaureate program
    - AB927: Student Transfer Achievement Act: Require CSUs and UCs to have a single GE pathway, among other things
    - AB1040: Ethnic Studies Graduation requirement for students who earn an ADT (not other degrees)
    - AB1111: Common Course Numbering: would standardize course numbering throughout the community college system

  - Second Hearing - Digital Fabrication Technology
